

The Call Sheet Template

Getting your call sheet-making skills under control will be the thing that'll make the difference between a successful shoot or a production nightmare. Being organized isn't optional, and I don't care if you're calling sixty people, or two people, the quality of your call sheet and the way that they are organized will be the biggest factor in how well your movie is progressing. Your chances to stay on schedule are usually measured by the quality of your call sheets. Here's an example of a call sheet from my first feature film, *Pickings*.
